WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Most real-estate companies have a zero tolerance policy for underage drinking and drug use, malicious destruction of property and disorderly loud behavior. Police your trash and take to the appropriate container provided by your rental unit for removal. Do not leave your trash in trash bags on the side of the road. You probably will be evicted in these laws are violated. Respect our residents and their properties.

Chapter 85 Section 5 of the Dewey Beach Code: Disorderly use of Dwellings

Fine: 1st Offense \$391.00 2nd Offense \$591.00 3nd Offense \$1000.00 (mandatory eviction)

- It is unlawful for a person occupying or present within a residence to generate any loud or raucous sound which causes an unreasonable annoyance or disturbance to other persons of normal sensitivity.
- It is unlawful for a person occupying or present within a residence to generate any loud or raucous sound which can be heard from 50 feet of the residence.
- 3) It is unlawful for any person occupying or present within a residence to make any noise disturbance or operate a sound amplifier, or any electronic equipment which emanates sound audible from any location beyond the property boundary at a sound level higher than 65 decibels (dBA) during the day (7:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.) or 55 dBA from 9:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.

Underage Drinking/Drug Use

Offenses Concerning Minors (underage possession or consumption of alcohol)

No person under the age of 21 years of age shall consume or possess alcohol in the State of Delaware. If found in violation the minimum mandatory fine in the Town of Dewey Beach is \$273.00 and can result in loss of drivers license.

Zero Tolerance DUI Law

It is unlawful to operate a motor vehicle with a blood alcohol content of .02% (approximately one alcoholic beverage) or more. If you are under 21 and you are arrested for DUI with a blood alcohol count of .02% or higher, you will lose your license automatically: 2 months for the first offense, 6 months for the second offense, 1 year for the third offense. If you don't have a license you can be fined \$200 for the first offense and between \$400 and \$1,000 for any subsequent offenses.

Alcohol

- Always keep your drink, of any kind, with you. Don't ever leave your drink unattended. If you ever
 do, get a new one. Don't take the chance that while your back is turned, someone may put
 something into your drink. If you suspect someone has placed a narcotic in you drink and you
 have consumed it, go to the hospital immediately. If possible secure the drink and give to the
 police department for appropriate testing.
- If someone you are with "passes out," do not just leave the person to sleep it off. Sometimes a
 blackout or stupor induced by alcohol or another drug can be life threatening. Do not be afraid to
 contact Emergency Medical Personnel. You may be saving a life.
- Do not, for any reason, take someone else's prescription medication or mix any medication with alcohol. Besides decreasing your ability to make healthy decisions, it could kill you.
- Never ride in a motor vehicle with someone who has been drinking.
- Possession of any paraphernalia that is intended to ingest, package, store or weigh illegal drugs is unlawful and will result in fines, mandatory jail time or probation and mandatory drug classes.
- It is unlawful to use any type of prescription medication that has not been prescribed to you by a
 Physician
- Immediately report any illegal drug activity to the Dewey Beach Police Department,

Commonly Violated Town Ordinances

Beach Curfew: The Beach is closed from 1:00 a.m. to 5:00a.m.daily.

Curfew For Minors: Minors under the age of 18 must be indoors at 11:00 p.m. on the weekdays and 12:00 a.m. in the weekends.

- *Sleeping in Vehicles: No person is permitted to sleep in a vehicle, which is located on Municipal/Public property in the Town of Dewey Beach.
- *Beach Fires: Campfires are permitted on the beach. A permit must be obtained from the Dewey Beach Town Hall before you begin.
- *Glass containers not permitted on the beach.
- *Loitering: Failing to move when lawfully ordered to do so by any police officer.
- **Criminal Trespass: When a person enters or remains unlawfully on real property, a
- building or a dwelling.
 *Urination/Defecation in Public: It is unlawful to urinate/defecate in a public place.
- *Criminal Impersonation: It is unlawful to impersonate another person in order to obtain a benefit.
- *Disorderly Conduct: When a person intentionally causes a public inconvenience, alarm or annoyance to any person or creates a risk.

EXAMPLE OF A TYPICAL VIOLATION

At 1:00 A.M. a Dewey Beach Police officer approached an individual for a loitering violation. When the officer approached they noticed the offender throwing a beer can in the bushes. When the police officer asked the person for their name, the individual used the name and date of birth of a sibling. Speaking to the offender, the officer noticed the 18-year-old had been drinking. The officer explained to the offender that they were under arrest and they began to curse loudly at the officer. The offender was placed under arrest and returned to the Dewey Beach Police for processing.
