WHEREAS, melanoma – the most common cancer in adults ages 20 to 30 – accounts for about 4% of skin cancer cases but causes approximately 79% of skin cancer deaths; and,

WHEREAS, according to the National Cancer Institute, the number of people developing melanoma is increasing faster than any other form of cancer; and, WHEREAS, May is Delaware's melanoma awareness month; and,

WHEREAS, the Dewey Beach business community sponsors the benefit event on the first weekend in May in memory of Kent McCullough, who died of this disease on February 9th, 2006 at the age of 36;
